Are you planning to go to post-secondary college or university? You MUST use the provincial STUDENT TRANSCRIPT SERVICE to send transcripts, unless otherwise noted by the post secondary institution.

You can easily send colleges and universities your transcript.

You will need to register for a BCeID first and then register to send your transcripts.

Your PEN (Provincial Education Number) is on the left hand corner of your report card or you can call or visit the office for your PEN number. Please see the next page for step-by-step instructions.

Step-by-Step Instructions for Student Transcripts On-line Service

Need: PEN numbers for students (on front page of report card at top – 9 digits long)

Directions:

- Step 1: Google "student transcripts bc" and select "Order transcripts and certificates" which is usually first choice given
- Step 2: Select "current student"
- Step 3: Scroll down until you see "Register for a Basic BCeID" and select that option (unless already have one)
- Step 4: fill out form making sure using LEGAL NAMES and also DO NOT use school email, USE personal email
- Step 5: take a picture of information on next screen so you remember your User ID and store your password somewhere for future use.
- Step 6: click on "Continue with Student Transcripts"
- Step 7: Give students their PEN number for this form.
- Step 8: Students fill out form using LEGAL NAMES and PERSONAL EMAIL once again
- Step 9: Go to their email to activate their account. This has to be done right away or it disappears. Click on the area that says "activate your account" in the email.
- Step 10: They will get a check mark with activation completed. They must log back into their account to see their transcript.
- Step 11: Show them the area to "send/order transcripts" for when they apply to university or college and then "view transcripts" where they can see and print their transcripts. Can print the transcripts for scholarship applications from here.

CREDITS FOR GRADUATION

Worried about not having enough credits to graduate in June?

Students must have completed 80 credits in order to participate in all graduation events (see the next page for more details). In some cases, a student may have to come back the following year to secure the required 80 credits. In this case, this student would be a Grad 2025 student and participate in the Grad 2025 Cap & Gown event (they may participate in this year's Promenade/Ball). We will send out "at-risk of not graduating" letters very soon. These letters alert students and parents that their child may not be on track to graduate in June, or may be at risk of not having enough credits to graduate in June.

Other Tidbits of Information:

- On Saturday June 22, we suggest grads, escorts, and family plan to have photos in Lebourdais Park. If everyone meets at Lebourdais Park there will be lots of opportunity to capture your grad with many of their friends.
- Seating at the arena for Cap and Gown and the promenade, (if the weather is bad), will be by ticket only. Seating is festival style seating; not reserved family seating. Doors will open at 5:00 pm on June 21st and on the 22nd. If an attendee & their family of either ceremony has any physical accessibility accommodations we need to be aware of, please let us know in advance for us to try to plan accordingly.
- We are anticipating offering each grad 4 tickets for each night. We are required to abide by building capacity regulations as set out by the Fire Marshal. *Capacity is number of people in the building. Typical West Fraser Centre events have the majority of people attending events in the stands Grad is not one of those typical events we have a large portion of the capacity in the building on the floor, so if it looks to you like there is capacity/space, there is not.
- There will be Grad Info Sheets given to students to request their wish for total number of tickets, escort information etc.
 - We truly try our best to accommodate larger than normal requests a lot is dependent on the demand and number of final graduates. **We are not alone in this as a majority of high schools & post-secondary institutions do not offer more than 4 tickets per graduate due to capacity issues. This year's grad class is also anticipated to be larger than some of our past graduating classes.
 - Because this is a very big community celebration & we wish we could accommodate everyone's wishes, we simply are not always able to. Please be

mindful in your requests – it is a joyous, complicated & sometimes stressful time for all the organizers, grads, staff and all our attendees when it comes to ticket distribution conversations. Over asking what you plan for those to come makes it a challenge to fulfill the needs of those who have complex/dynamic family situations.

- Always let the office know of changes to your ticket request information to ensure best distribution & fairness of ticket allocations to grads & their families.
 For example, if you only need 2 tickets instead of 4, please give your unused tickets back to the office so they can be redistributed.
- If you are in a situation where your request is beyond what we can offer, is there
 another way to celebrate with your families & friends around grad time that you
 can incorporate into the weekend of celebrations that do not require you to
 have larger numbers of tickets?
- A first round of tickets will be distributed to grads who have paid their fees in the first two weeks of June 2024. Likely in the week before or days leading up to grad we will disperse as equitably as possible any additional ticket requests.
- If fees are a hardship please contact Mrs. Knauf.
- Only those students who have 80 or more credits and who have met the requirements for graduation can participate in the Cap & Gown ceremony.
- Grade 12 students who have not acquired 80 credits are permitted to go to the grad ball.
- If taking online courses via QDL & wanting to partake in ceremonies, please plan to meet with Mrs. Knauf. There are details/paperwork/fees etc. needed to be checked & completed.

The responsibility of the school is to provide a transcript of marks (Dogwood certificate) upon the completion of Grade 12. Grade 12 students are also encouraged to research and find scholarships and bursaries which they may be qualified for online. Many large businesses and organizations have awards for students going to post-secondary.

Notice to our Students and Parents/Guardians/Caregivers

Quesnel School District Threat Assessment Protocol

The Quesnel School District and our community partners are committed to having safe, caring and inclusive schools. In the event that a student makes a threat of violence or harm to other students, staff or the school community, the school will initiate the Quesnel School District threat assessment protocol.

Violence, Threat and Risk Assessment Protocol

In the event of a serious threat to the wellbeing of students or staff, A Violence, Threat and Risk Assessment Protocol will be initiated.

A threat is an expression of intent to do harm or act out violently against someone or something. They may be verbal, written, drawn, posted on the internet or made by gesture. Threats must be taken seriously, investigated and responded to.

What is the purpose of a threat assessment?

- . to ensure the safety of all students, staff, parents and others
- to ensure a full understanding of the context of the threat
- to understand factors contributing to the threat makers' behaviour
- to be proactive in developing an intervention plan that addresses the emotional and physical safety of the threat maker
- . to promote the emotional and physical safety of all

What behaviours initiate a VTRA?

A VTRA will be initiated when behaviours include, but are not limited to, serious violence with intent to harm or kill, verbal/written threats to harm/kill others, Internet website/social media threats to harm/kill others, possession of weapons (including replicas), bomb threats, and fire setting.

Duty to report

Staff, parents, students and community members have a duty to report all threat-related behaviours to keep our school community safe.

VTRA Team

Our school has a multi-disciplinary threat assessment team. The team includes principal, vice-principal, district staff, school counsellors and police.

What happens in a student threat assessment?

After a report, the principal will activate the protocol for initial response. The team is activated and interviews may be held with the student(s), the threat maker, parents and staff to determine the level of risk and develop an appropriate response to the incident. Intervention plans will be developed and shared with parents, staff and students as required.

Can someone refuse to participate in a threat assessment process?

It is important for all parties to participate. If someone is reluctant to participate for some reason, the threat assessment process will continue in order to keep our school safe.
