## COUNT YOUR CREDITS

## What do you need to graduate???

1. MINIMUM amount of credits needed to graduate: 80 credits $=20$ courses
2. Specific required courses in grades 10,11 and 12
3. More courses may be required for post-secondary programs

## Graduation Program: British Columbia Certificate of Graduation (Dogwood Diploma)

In order to meet graduation requirements and be awarded a British Columbia Certificate of Graduation (Dogwood Diploma), students must earn a minimum of 80 credits and write all provincial assessments of numeracy and literacy. The 80 credits must include 52 credits for required courses and a minimum of 28 elective credits. The 28 elective credits may be from Ministry-Authorized or Board/Authority Authorized (BAA) courses, post-secondary courses or external credentials, but not Locally Developed courses. Students must also complete a minimum of 16 credits at the Grade 12 level, including a required Language Arts 12 course and Career Life Connections. At least 4 credits must have an Indigenous focus. (Indigenous-Focused Graduation Requirements - Province of British Columbia).

*Sign up before the summer if you plan to work during the summer.

* You must meet a few requirements prior to being your Work hours being used for credit hours.

## THE DUAL CREDIT PROGRAM

## SD28, Skilled Trades BC AND CNC QUESNEL

If your career plan has indicated an interest in the Apprenticeship Programs you can apply, beginning after the age of 15 , to be accepted in a "Tuition PAID!"college Apprenticeship program (For 2025 this includes carpentry, Millwright, and Welding).

You would be getting credits at both the college and for HS (4 Gr 12 Credits)
In some cases you may be able to apply for the Prince George CNC programs: Auto. HD mechanics, hairdressing, etc. But please note, we only get funded for these PG programs if they are not filled by SD57 students.

This is a competitive application and should be submitted early
For the Dual Credit program:

1) Must complete English 12 and CLC 12 during Semester 1 (Dual Credit is in Semester 2 of Grade 12)
2) Must have all other required graduation courses completed prior to the start of program

## Work In Trades PROGRAM Grade 11 A, B and Grade 12 A, B

If you are (or are planning to) work in a Red Seal Trade during school or in the summers... you have the opportunity to get 4 credits for every 120 of Skilled Trades documented hours (that could equal to 20 plus credits)

It is important for you to fill out he application early to your hiring date.
You will be required to:
-Fill out application form (signed by Yourself, Parents, Business, School)
-complete the Safety, Before, During and After workbooks
-Complete work plan for each of the 120 hours
