Principal's Message

It's hard to believe, but we are already halfway through May, and into the last six weeks of the school year. This is the toughest time for students, as the weather improves, and it's hard to be inside all day, but hard work pays off and may mean the difference between passing or failing a course. Keep working hard and sprint through the end of the year. Attendance is especially important at this time of year. Please encourage your child to be here and put in a good effort.

Just a reminder that not all graduation events are sponsored by the school. School-sponsored events are upcoming — the Grad Barbeque on June 7th, the Cap and Gown on June 21st, and the Grad Ball and Promenade on June 22nd. TERM 3 LEARNING UPDATES

Term 3 learning updates (report cards) and Graduation Status Updates were distributed to students on April 29th. Learning updates have also been posted to the parent portal.

SNAPCHAT, NETFLIX & TIKTOK BLOCKED FROM DISTRICT NETWORK

The Quesnel School District has decided to block Snapchat and Netflix from the district network. This decision was made due to the drain on the bandwidth, the fact that Snapchat is not an educational tool and Netflix not being licensed for use in schools. The Snapchat and Netflix platforms will not be accessible through the district network for devices plugged into the network or connected to the secure/public WIFI. The only way to access Snapchat and Netflix at a district site will be by using a personal data plan which may result in an increased cost to individuals. This became effective April 15, 2024. TikTok was blocked from the district network on May 23, 2023 due to the security risk to personal information and the drain on the bandwidth.

GRAD ASSESSMENTS - June 10—14, 2024

During this assessment period, various classes will write Numeracy 10 and Literacy 10 as indicated in the schedule below. We have also scheduled Literacy 10/Numeracy 10/Literacy 12 make-up sessions for any grade 12 students missing these assessments for graduation. There is a signup sheet in the office for anyone who would like to pre-write or re-write Literacy 12 on June 11. Scores from the April assessments will be posted across from the Career Centre door once they have been released. Students are permitted to write assessments up to 3 times in order to better their score.

Please note the following:

- If your student misses their in-class assessment, the only make-up opportunity is Thurs, June 13 (8:30 12:30 pm in Room 302).
- Students are permitted 3 hours to write their assessment. If your student is writing an afternoon assessment, they may not be finished writing until 3:30 pm so they may need to find an alternate way home if they ride a bus.
- All classes/blocks will run as normal, so if your student is not writing an assessment (s), they are expected to be in class. If your student finishes their assessment early, they are expected to go to their regular class or the library/Career Centre—no hallway wondering.

STUDENT TRANSCRIPT SERVICE

Are you planning to go to post-secondary college or university? You MUST use the provincial STUDENT TRANSCRIPT SERVICE to send transcripts, unless otherwise noted by the post secondary institution.

You can easily send colleges and universities your transcript.

You will need to register for a BCeID first and then register to send your transcripts.

Step-by-Step Instructions for Student Transcripts On-line Service

Need: PEN numbers for students (on front page of report card at top – 9 digits long)

Directions:


- Step 1: Google "student transcripts bc" and select "Order transcripts and certificates" which is usually first choice given
- Step 2: Select "current student"
- Step 3: Scroll down until you see "Register for a Basic BCeID" and select that option (unless already have one)
- Step 4: fill out form making sure using LEGAL NAMES and also DO NOT use school email, USE personal email
- Step 5: take a picture of information on next screen so you remember your User ID and store your password somewhere for future use.
- Step 6: click on "Continue with Student Transcripts"
- Step 7: Give students their PEN number for this form.
- Step 8: Students fill out form using LEGAL NAMES and PERSONAL EMAIL once again
- Step 9: Go to their email to activate their account. This has to be done right away or it disappears. Click on the area that says "activate your account" in the email.
- Step 10: They will get a check mark with activation completed. They must log back into their account to see their transcript.
- Step 11: Show them the area to "send/order transcripts" for when they apply to university or college and then "view transcripts" where they can see and print their transcripts. Can print the transcripts for scholarship applications from here.


