CORRELIEU CAREERS PROGRAM

Are you planning to work or volunteer this summer? If so, would you like to earn elective course credit? There are two ways you can do this.

1. Work Experience (WEX for short)

WEX is a four-credit course. You earn credit by completing 100 hours of paid or volunteer work, along with assignments that your career teachers provide. You may get started this summer and continue the course into the 2024-2025 school year. If you are interested, please see Mr. Runge or Ms. McFarlane for an application package this week. You must complete the registration process BEFORE you start claiming hours for your work.

2. Youth Work in Trades

You may already be working in a trade, or planning to work in a trade this summer. If so, you should consider signing up for the Youth Work in Trades program. Through this program, you may claim up to 16 course credits (120 working hours for each course) towards high school graduation). An additional benefit for participating in this program is a \$1000 scholarship that you can use towards tuition and materials for a post-secondary program. If you are interested, please see Mr. Runge this week for an application package.

SPARE BLOCKS

At Correlieu Secondary School (CSS) a growing concern is students on spare blocks. In September 2024, grade 10 and 11 students at CSS will be required to have a full course load (8 courses).

If students are enrolling in online courses, they need to know that these courses need to be completed at home and that they are still required be enrolled in a full course load at CSS. CSS is not funded to support online learning.

Grade 12 students requesting a spare block will need to have permission from the Principal or Vice Principal. In addition, a plan will be established for the student to either be supervised in the building or off campus during their spare block. Failure to follow the plan may result in disciplinary measures.

ATHLETICS UPDATE

Congratulations to all 17 Correlieu athletes who attended the BC High School Provincial Track and Field Championships in Nanaimo June 6th - 8th . There were some amazing highs and a few heartbreaking lows, but we are equally proud of ALL of you for putting in your best effort and being a great group of athletes to be around and to coach. You made us proud!

There were lots of personal bests and strong efforts during very long, hot days. On one of the days, some of the athletes had to be at the track by 6:30 am and we did not leave until 8:00 pm. We had two athletes get ribbons (top 8 placements) and two more made the top 10 in their events. Those athletes are:

Are you planning to go to post-secondary college or university? **You MUST use the provincial STUDENT TRANSCRIPT SERVICE to send transcripts, unless otherwise noted by the post secondary institution.**

You can easily send colleges and universities your transcript.

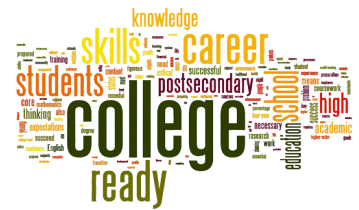

You will need to register for a BCeID first and then register to send your transcripts.

Your PEN (Provincial Education Number) is on the left hand corner of your report card or you can call or visit the office for your PEN number. Please see the next page for step-by-step instructions.

POST-SECONDARY APPLICATION PROCESS - BC & ALBERTA



For students wanting to apply to any post secondary institution in BC, they can access this through educationplannerbc.ca

For students wanting to apply to any post secondary institution in Alberta, access this through applyalberta.ca

Students can access counsellor support for applying to college or university every Friday during the morning Study Block in room 207 with Ms Pelchat.

Step-by-Step Instructions for Student Transcripts On-line Service

Need: PEN numbers for students (on front page of report card at top – 9 digits long)

Directions:

Step 1: Google “student transcripts bc” and select “Order transcripts and certificates” which is usually first choice given

Step 2: Select “current student”

Step 3: Scroll down until you see “Register for a Basic BCeID” and select that option (unless already have one)

Step 4: fill out form making sure using LEGAL NAMES and also DO NOT use school email, USE personal email

Step 5: take a picture of information on next screen so you remember your User ID and store your password somewhere for future use.

Step 6: click on “Continue with Student Transcripts”

Step 7: Give students their PEN number for this form.

Step 8: Students fill out form using LEGAL NAMES and PERSONAL EMAIL once again

Step 9: Go to their email to activate their account. This has to be done right away or it disappears. Click on the area that says “activate your account” in the email.

Step 10: They will get a check mark with activation completed. They must log back into their account to see their transcript.

Step 11: Show them the area to “send/order transcripts” for when they apply to university or college and then “view transcripts” where they can see and print their transcripts. Can print the transcripts for scholarship applications from here.
