CSS or McN 2 x \$500 *Funds may be divided*
- A number of awards will be distributed based on contribution to school and community
 - Available for 12 months
- 2-C **ARROW TRANSPORTATION SYSTEMS AWARD**
CSS 2 x \$500
- Preference to children, then grandchildren of Arrow Transportation Employees (state employee and relationship)
 - Consideration given to academic standing, need, community & school involvement, leadership
 - Available for 24 months
- 3-D **AUXILIARY TO G.R. BAKER MEMORIAL HOSPITAL AWARD**
CSS \$500
- Available to students entering a **health care field**, with preference to Canadian northern universities
 - Must *include a letter* explaining qualifications, a brief high school autobiography, a list of employment and volunteer activities
 - Available for 6 months
- 4-C **BARLOW CREEK ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PARENT ADVISORY COUNCIL BURSARY**
CSS or McN \$500
- Must have attended Barlow Creek Elementary for 3 years (state the years you attended and grades)
 - Recipient must attend Graduation Ceremonies to receive Bursary
 - Based on financial need
 - Available for 12 months
- 5-D **BARLOW CREEK VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT AWARD**
CSS or McN \$500
- First preference: To a member or child of a member of the Barlow Creek VFD (state employee and relationship)
 - If no student meets first preference, then there will be a selection process by BCVFD
 - Academic standing and financial need are considered in decision
 - Available for 18 months
- 6-D **BILL MAGNOWSKI MEMORIAL LEGACY FUND AWARD**
CSS or McN \$125
- First preference will be given to a student who has an **agricultural background or is an active participant in the local farming community or is a current or past member of the Quesnel 4-H Program.**
 - Second preference to a student that will be continuing with a career in **agriculture.**
 - Financial need and academic standing will be a consideration
 - Available for 6 months

7-D **BOUCHIE LAKE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PARENT ADVISORY COUNCIL AWARD**

CSS or McN 2 x \$250

- Must have attended Bouchie Lake School for a minimum of 4 years (state years and grades)
- Must *include a letter* (written by student applicant) stating contributions and commitment to citizenship at both Bouchie Lake School and secondary schools
- Consideration given to academic, vocational and technical merit as well as need
- Available for 12 months

8-D **BOUCHIE LAKE VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTERS ASSOCIATION AWARD**

CSS or McN \$500

- First preference to current or past (within 3 years) VFD members' children/grandchildren/dependents
- Second preference to students that attended BLE and lived in the BLE catchment for a minimum of three years
- Available for 6 months

9-C **BRIAN CULLINANE LEGACY AWARD**

CSS or McN \$1000

- Based solely on characteristics that Brian exemplified; kindness, respect, humor, trust, loyalty, friendship, enrich the lives of others
- Must *include a 500-word essay* describing how YOU exemplify these characteristics (donor will receive a copy of essay)
- Any post-secondary education (does not have to be an accredited institution)
- Available for 12 months

10-C **BRODEX TRADES BURSARY**

CSS \$500

- Applicant must be entering one of the following **trades: heavy duty equipment technician (mechanic), machinist, commercial transport vehicle mechanic or welder**
- Must *include a 250-word essay* describing why you want a career in the trades as well as future expectations in your trade
- Financial need
- Available for 12 months

11-C **C.D. HOY MEMORIAL AWARD**

CSS or McN 2 x \$2000

- Based on financial need, however, Academic Achievement, Community, Citizenship and School activities will be considered
- Preference to students attending Vancouver or Victoria post-secondary institutions
- Available for 12 months

12-C **CANADIAN UNION OF POSTAL WORKERS (CUPW) LOCAL 816 BURSARY****CSS or McN 2 x \$750**

- To be awarded to a child or grandchild of a CUPW Local 816 member (state employee and relationship)
- Based on financial need
- If no CUPW 816 applicants, then to a child or grandchild of any other CUPW Local (state employee and local) if no CUPW applicants then other union members child or grandchild may be considered IF the union is affiliated with the BC Federation of Labour or the CLC
- Available for 12 months

13-D **CANADIAN UNION OF PUBLIC EMPLOYEES (CUPE) LOCAL 4990 BURSARIES****CSS or McN****Regular Bursary \$500 Memorial Bursary \$500 Trades Bursary \$300**

- Applicant must be child or grandchild of a member of Local 4990 (state employee and relationship)
- *Application required* and can be obtained from the Career Center
- The trade bursary is available to a student pursuing an occupation in the trades sector
- All awards based on financial need
- Available for 12 months

14-C **CARIBOO PULP & PAPER COMPANY SCHOLARSHIP****CSS 2 x \$1500**

- To children/grandchildren of Cariboo Pulp and Paper employees (state employee and relationship)
- In the event there are not 2 as above, 1 scholarship may go a minority person, preferably of Indigenous Ancestry
- Applicant must be attending a **publicly funded** and degree granting institution, and an applicant pursuing a ***career in the forest sector (Biology, engineering, silviculture, skilled trades, accounting etc.)***
- Based on Academic Achievement
- Available for 6 months

15-C **CARIBOO REGIONAL DISTRICT BURSARY****CSS or McN \$1000**

- Available to students ***pursuing studies towards a career in local government (this could include areas such as public administration, planning, bylaw enforcement, engineering, environmental studies)***
- "B" or better average throughout Grade 12
- Must ***include a 500-word essay*** about your planned future studies and how you plan to incorporate your education into a career in government
- Recipient must maintain registration in a minimum of 60% of a full course load for their first year of post-secondary education
- Based on financial need
- Available for 12 months

- 16-C **CARSON ELEMENTARY PAC (PAMELA GIESBRECHT MEMORIAL AWARD)**
CSS or McN \$350
- To a student who attended Carson Elementary for a minimum of 3 years while in the intermediate grades and who has made contributions to the school and Quesnel communities (state years and grades)
 - Available for 12 months
- 17-D **CATHOLIC WOMENS' LEAGUE (CHALMERS MEMORIAL) AWARD**
CSS or McN \$600
- Restricted to children or grandchildren of members of St. Ann's Catholic Women's League (state member and relationship)
 - Student must be an active church member
 - Application form is required* and are available at the back of the church
 - Available for 18 months
- 18-D **CITY OF QUESNEL AWARD**
CSS or McN 2 x \$1200
- Based on financial need then academic excellence
 - Must *include an essay* describing contribution to the Quesnel community
 - Successful recipient must provide the following information upon request; DOB, contact info, email and SIN
 - Available for 13 months
- 19-C **CORRELIEU CLASS OF 1979 LEGACY BURSARY**
CSS or McN \$500
- Based on financial need and citizenship/community service
 - Available for 12 months
- 20-C **CSS PARENT ADVISORY COUNCIL AWARDS**
CSS 3 x \$350
- One award to be awarded based on scholastic achievement
 - One award to be based on financial need
 - One award available for a student who has a learning, physical or lifestyle challenge
 - Must *include a 250-500-word essay* describing the challenge and explain how you have managed; also explain future educational plans. Students can use a scribe for the essay)
 - Available for 12 months
- 21-C **DARCIE EDYE MEMORIAL AWARD**
CSS or MCN \$500
- Available to students entering *a field which works with persons with special needs*
 - Must *include a 250-word essay* describing your experience working with special needs and why you have chosen this particular career
 - Available for 12 months

- 22-C **DRAGON LAKE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PARENT ADVISORY COUNCIL SERVICE BURSARY**
CSS or McN \$500
- Must have attended Dragon Lake Elementary School for a minimum of 3 school years (state grades)
 - Based on financial need then service
 - Available for 12 months
- 23-C **ÉCOLE RED BLUFF LHTAKO PARENT ADVISORY COUNCIL SERVICE BURSARY**
CSS or McN 2 x \$500
- Recipient must have shown active participation in community and school services
 - Must *include a letter* outlining leadership abilities, responsibilities and services to school and community
 - Based on financial need
 - Available for 12 months
- 24-D **ELEVATE NORTH BURSARY**
CSS or McN 2 x \$500 *Amount dependent on donations*
- To a student who has suffered the loss of a parent through death, abandonment or legal divorce
 - Financial need
 - Available for 12 months
- 25-C **EMCON SERVICES INC. BURSARY**
CSS or McN 4 x \$500
- To a child or grandchild of Emcon Services employee (state employee and relationship)
 - Two awards for *academics/engineering* students
 - Two awards for *industry related trades (heavy duty mechanic, welding, bridge worker, industrial warehousing)*
 - Based on financial need, effort, interest and responsibility and C+ or better GPA preferred
 - Must be used during the school year immediately following graduation
- 26-C **FOUR RIVERS CO-OPERATIVE (IN MEMORY OF BRUCE YORSTON) AWARD**
CSS or McN \$800
- Preference to a student with agricultural background going into an *agricultural field*, second preference to a student with an *agricultural background*
 - Based on financial need then Academic standing
 - Paid out over two semesters
 - Available for 24 months

- 27-D **FRIENDS OF BARKERVILLE SCHOLARSHIP IN THE MEMORY OF JERRY MACDONALD**
CSS or McN **2 x \$500**
- Must *include an original piece of writing*, at least 500 words minimum, focusing on a description of an event, a location, person or persons from the Barkerville Gold Rush period of history (1848 to 1940). This can include any of the communities that were part of the Cariboo Goldfields. Writing should be historically accurate and designed to capture the readers' interest
 - The winning entry may also be printed in our newsletter and must be suitable for publication
 - Entries may be reprinted for educational purposes
 - ***Preference to a student entering the field of History and/or Journalism***
 - Amounts may vary at the donors discretion
 - Based on Academic achievement
 - Available for 24 months
- 28-C **GENEVA IRWIN ACADEMIC AWARD**
CSS or McN **\$500**
- To a student of Indigenous ancestry who has been on the secondary school census through Grades 10, 11 and 12
 - Based on financial need then academic achievement, community and school involvement and citizenship plus participation in the classroom
 - Available for 12 months
- 29-D **GIRL GUIDES OF CANADA – QUESNEL DISTRICT AWARD**
CSS or McN **\$500**
- Must have been an active member of Girl Guides of Canada, Quesnel District for the last two years, with high participation and attendance and must be a good role model to other girls in the Guiding movement while actively promote Guiding to others
 - Special *application form* in Career Centre and *special letter of reference* required from Unit Guider
 - Must *include a letter* on how Guiding has enriched your life and influenced your future plans
 - Available for 18 months
- 30-C **HEATH ONSTINE MEMORIAL AWARD**
CSS or McN **\$1000**
- Must be taking or have taken at least one music related course while in grades 10-12 at SD28 or by private lesson (must submit proof of private lessons from instructor)
 - Must be taking ***music courses or by private lesson during Post Secondary***
 - Available 12 months
- 31-C **INTEGRIS CREDIT UNION BURSARY**
CSS or McN **2 x \$1000**
- Please *provide a short summary* of the financial need considerations
 - Parent or student must be a member of Integris Credit Union (Must *provide membership number*)
 - Student must *submit an outline* of activities or sports describing contribution to community and school
 - Student must also *submit a 250-word essay* on their long term goals, 5-10 years, and their aspirations to contribute to their community
 - Available for 12 months

- 32-D **JERRY MACDONALD MEMORIAL QUESNEL PARENTS FOR FRENCH AWARD**
CSS \$500
- Must *include a 150-word essay* finishing the following statement "French Immersion has enabled me to be a better Canadian because..."
 - Must also include *a letter of reference*, in English, from a French Immersion teacher
 - Based on all-round participation in classwork, extra-curricular activities and the ability to get along with other people; Financial need is a consideration
 - If no student meets the above criteria, the bursary will not be awarded
 - Included in this Award is a \$25 Canadian Parents for French one year membership. Upon proof of current membership the Award will be for the full \$500
 - Available for 24 months
- 33-C **JUNE PLUMMER EDUCATION MEMORIAL AWARD**
CSS or McN \$1000
- To a student beginning studies to become an *elementary school teacher*
 - School and community involvement as well as leadership through secondary school years are of equal importance
 - Academic standing and financial needs are important but are not the primary factor
 - Available for 12 months
- 34-C **KERSLEY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PARENT ADVISORY COUNCIL SCHOLARSHIP**
CSS or McN 2 x \$250
- Must have attended Kersley Elementary a minimum of 3 full years in the intermediate classes (state years and Grades)
 - Must be a well-rounded student, with overall good values and a contributor to the school and community
 - Available for 24 months
- 35-D **KERSLEY VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTER'S ASSOCIATION BURSARY**
CSS or McN 2 x \$300
- Must reside within the Kersley Fire Protection boundary (provide address)
 - Financial need
 - Available for 12 months
- 36-C **KERSLEY WOMENS' INSTITUTE AWARD**
CSS or McN \$200
- Based on financial need then academic achievement
 - Must be a child or grandchild of a Kersley Women's Institute member OR a student who lives in the Kersley-Australian area (bound by Durrell Road on the north and SD 28 boundary on the south) (provide address and/or proof of membership)
 - Available for 12 months

- 37-C **KIM VERGE MEMORIAL AWARD**
CSS OR McN **\$1000**
- Available to students pursuing a post-secondary education in **animal care – a career involving the health, welfare or training of animals (veterinarian, grooming, training etc.)**
 - Post Secondary must be through an accredited institution
 - Must *include a 250-word essay* describing your involvement with animals and how this will benefit your career plans
 - Financial need and grades are determining factors
 - Community service and extra curricular will be considered
 - Available 18 months
- 38-D **KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS COUNCIL 5792 BURSARY**
CSS, QDL or McN **\$1000** *Funds may be divided to a max of 3 awards*
- Available to children and grandchildren of members of Council 5792 (St. Ann’s Catholic Church) in good standing (state member and relationship)
 - *Application required* and can be obtained from the career Centre or the Church
 - Based on financial need
 - Available within 18 months of graduation
- 39-C **L & M GALE AWARD**
CSS or McN **2 x \$1000**
- For a student entering a **Nurse’s Aide Program**
 - Academic achievement, financial need, school and community involvement are of equal importance
 - Available for 12 months
- 40-C **LAKEVIEW ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PARENT ADVISORY COUNCIL AWARD**
CSS or McN **\$500**
- Applicant must have attended Lakeview Elementary for a minimum of 3 school years (state years and grades)
 - Demonstrated leadership and community responsibility as well as have maintained high academics
 - Financial need
 - Available for 18 months
- 41-C **LANCE BERG CONSTRUCTION MEMORIAL BURSARY**
CSS or McN **\$750**
- For a student entering a **Trades program at CNC**, Quesnel, preference to a student entering **Carpentry**
 - Must *include a 250-word essay* describing why you want to be a carpenter and what impact this profession will have on your adult life
 - Financial need
 - Available for 12 month

- 42-D **MAGGIE BELLO MEMORIAL AWARD (BIG BROTHERS BIG SISTERS)**
CSS or McN **2 x \$500**
- General participation in the Quesnel Big Brothers/Big Sisters Program for a minimum of three years as a Little Brother or Sister or as an in-school Teen Mentor for a minimum of two semesters (state years participated and how)
 - Must *include a letter of 250 – 500 words* expressing what you learned from your participation in the Big Brothers/Big Sisters program
 - Academic achievement, financial need, citizenship are all of equal importance
 - Available for 36 months
- 43 -C **MANJOT PURI MEMORIAL AWARD**
CSS **\$500**
- Must be in good standing with the school, be of good character, sense of humor and respectful
 - Must include a *250-word essay* explaining goals after graduation
 - To a student who excels in athletics and academics
 - Financial need
 - Available for 12 months
- 44-C **MAPLE DRIVE JUNIOR SECONDARY SCHOOL AWARD**
CSS or McN **1 x \$300**
- Must have resided in their Grade 10 year within the traditional catchment area of MDJS (state address)
 - Must have clearly demonstrated a “Strive for Excellence” during Grades 10-12 and be a person of good character
 - Must have contributed in all three areas: athletics, academic achievement and service to the school
 - Financial need
 - Available for 12 months
- 45-C **MAX HELZEL MEMORIAL AWARD**
CSS or McN **\$400**
- Preference to a student entering nursing in even years (2024)
 - Preference to a student entering ***engineering in odd years (2025)***
 - Marks, school/community involvement, and financial need are all of equal importance in making decision
 - Available for 12 months
- 46-C **MURRAY BOAL MUSIC BURSARY**
CSS or McN **\$1000**
- Preference to a student ***continuing in a music related field*** and MUST have taken 2 or more music courses at CSS or MCN
 - Financial need
 - Available for 12 months

- 47-D **NORTH CARIBOO METIS ASSOCIATION PAUL GAUTHIER MEMORIAL AWARD**
CSS or McN \$500
- Proof of Metis heritage required, either by providing NCMA Membership, or by being on the School District #28 Indigenous Census for a minimum of Grader 12 year, or by providing Metis Nation BC Citizenship Card/Number
 - Must *include a 500-word essay* on the Metis heritage
 - Financial need and marks are of equal importance
 - Community service and/or extra-curricular activities are a determining factor
 - Available for 12 months
- 48-D **NORTH CARIBOO METIS ASSOCIATION WENDY FORGET MEMORIAL AWARD**
CSS or McN \$500
- Proof of Metis heritage required, either by providing NCMA Membership, or by being on the School District #28 Indigenous Census for a minimum of Grader 12 year, or by providing Metis Nation BC Citizenship Card/Number
 - Must *include a 500-word essay* on the Metis heritage
 - Financial need and marks are of equal importance
 - Community service and/or extra-curricular activities are a determining factor
 - Available for 12 months
- 49-C **OLD AGE PENSION ORGANIZATION (BRANCH 77) AWARD**
CSS or McN 2 x \$1000
- Available to students entering a ***health care field in Seniors Care (e.g. dietician, lab tech, nurse, doctor, physiotherapy/physical therapy, pharmacy, long term care aid)***
 - Financial need is a major consideration, as well as academics and school/community involvement
 - Available for 12 months
- 50-D **ORDER OF THE EASTERN STAR AWARD**
CSS or McN \$500
- Must be related to a member of the Order of the Eastern Star (state name of member and relationship)
 - Awarded on academic, vocational or technical merits, financial need and community involvement considered
 - Must *include a resume* with a statement of personal aims and goals
 - Must *include a special application form* available from the Career Centre
 - Financial need
 - Available for 18 months
- 51-C **PARKLAND ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PARENT ADVISORY COUNCIL SCHOLARSHIP**
CSS or McN \$200
- To a student who attended Parkland Elementary for a minimum of 3 years while in the intermediate program (state years and grades)
 - Academic achievement
 - Available for 12 months

- 52-C **PAT MARSH MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP**
CSS or McN **\$1000**
- Student doesn't need to be the top athlete
