What do you need to graduate???

- MINIMUM amount of credits needed to graduate:
 80 credits = 20 courses
- 1. Specific required courses in grades 10, 11 and 12
- **1.** More courses may be required for post-secondary programs





Graduation Checklist

- To graduate, students are required to have <u>80 credits</u> in total
- At least 16 credits must be at the Grade 12 level, including a required Grade 12 Language Arts course and the Career Life Connections course
- You must complete at least 1 Fine Arts/Applied skills course between grade 10 and 12
- One Indigenous-focused class







Graduation Program: British Columbia Certificate of Graduation (Dogwood Diploma)

In order to meet graduation requirements and be awarded a British Columbia Certificate of Graduation (Dogwood Diploma), students must earn a minimum of 80 credits and write all provincial assessments of numeracy and literacy. The 80 credits must include 52 credits for required courses and a minimum of 28 elective credits. The 28 elective credits may be from Ministry-Authorized or Board/Authority Authorized (BAA) courses, post-secondary courses or external credentials, but not Locally Developed courses. Students must also complete a minimum of 16 credits at the Grade 12 level, including a required Language Arts 12 course and Career Life Connections. At least 4 credits must have an Indigenous focus. (Indigenous-Focused Graduation Requirements - Province of British Columbia).

Work Experience and Career Programs

Career Programs or certificate courses can prepare you for Post-Secondary Education and can provide you with employment opportunities.

Some options include:

Firefighting, Wildfire (X block courses)

Work Experience 12 (credit for work hours)*

Youth Work in Trades (credit for work hours with a ticketed tradesperson)*

Dual Credit - attend the college in sem 2 of grade 12 year (Trades & ECE)

Many Business programs recommend Calculus 12 BE AWARE: LANGUAGE CREDITS FOR POST-SECONDARY


UBC/SFU and some Alberta Universities may require a grade 11 level second language course for admission.






Overview of Mathematics Pathways




