# Choosing your English Courses

## ▶ Grade 11 – 3 choices

1. **Literary Studies** – most resembles “traditional” course
2. **Creative Writing** – focus on creative writing skills – not best option if you don’t like writing
3. **Spoken Language** – focus on spoken communication/oral traditions

\*All courses include a Composition requirement – may include novel, short story, paragraph and essay writing, and presentations.

1. **English 12**
2. **English First Peoples 12** (meets Indigenous content requirement)



<b>Graduation Program: British Columbia Certificate of Graduation (Dogwood Diploma) English</b>	
<p>In order to meet graduation requirements and be awarded a British Columbia Certificate of Graduation (Dogwood Diploma), students must earn a minimum of 80 credits and write provincial assessments of numeracy and literacy. The 80 credits include 52 credits for required courses (including 8 credits of Career Education courses and at least 4 credits of Indigenous-focused coursework) and a minimum of 28 elective credits. The 28 elective credits may be from Ministry-Authorized or Board/Authority Authorized (BAA) courses, post-secondary courses or external credentials, but not Locally Developed courses. Students must also complete a minimum of 16 credits at the Grade 12 level, including a required Language Arts 12 course and Career Life Connections.</p>



Some Schools such as UVIC require you to have a minimum of 73% in your English 12 course and 77% in your Math 12 course for certain programs.

- ✓ Select your **PRE-REQUISITE COURSES** for Post-Secondary

- ✓ Make sure you have **BACKUPS**
- ✓ All Grade 10s and 11s **MUST HAVE 8 COURSES** listed (online courses are taken in your own time)
- ✓ Put down any **X BLOCK COURSES** (not in elective boxes but in X block box)
